

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE SHAMBLERS CONSTITUTION

1. TITLE

The Club shall be called Northamptonshire Shamblers, hereafter to be referred to as “the Club”. From January 2015 the Club will no longer be affiliated to the Ramblers Association. However, the Club will still follow the guidelines issued by said Association.

2. OBJECTS

To foster and promote walking and the enjoyment and appreciation of the countryside of Northamptonshire and surrounding counties.

3. MEMBERSHIP

3.1 Membership of the Club shall be open to any person completing a membership application form and paying the relevant subscription/joining fee as determined by the Annual General Meeting of the Club Members. The subscription will cover the period 1 August to 31 July or part thereof of the current or following year.

3.2 Members are responsible for their own personal injury/accident insurance as the Club does not provide insurance cover for those taking part in any activity organised by the Club.

3.3 At the start of each walk, each participant will sign a register that confirms their fitness for the walk and to acknowledge that item 3.2 applies.

4. EXPULSION OF MEMBERS

Members of the Club whose conduct is inappropriate or who decline to abide by any of the Rules or Bylaws may be expelled or suspended by a resolution passed at a meeting of the General Committee where their entrance fee and subscriptions may be forfeited. Members shall have the right to appeal in person to the management committee with regard to any decision affecting themselves, provided that notice of such appeal be submitted to an Executive Officer, in writing, within seven days of notification of the decision.

5. EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The Officers of the Club shall be Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer.

6. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

6.1 All Officers shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club from and by the Members of the Club.

6.2 All Officers are elected for a period of one year, but may be re-elected to the same office or another office the following year.

7. GENERAL COMMITTEE

7.1 The affairs of the Club shall be controlled by a General Committee comprising of the Executive Officers of the Club and two other Members elected from, and by, the Full Members of the Club. The General Committee shall meet at agreed intervals and not less than two times per year.

7.2 The duties of the General Committee shall be:

7.2.1 To control the affairs of the Club on behalf of the Members.

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- 7.2.2 To keep accurate accounts of the finances of the Club through the Treasurer. These should be available for reasonable inspection by Members and should be examined before every Annual General Meeting. The Club shall maintain a bank current account and the following Officers shall be authorised to sign: the Treasurer and Secretary.
- 7.2.3 To co-opt additional members of the Committee as the Committee feels this is necessary. Co-opted members shall not be entitled to a vote on the Committee.
- 7.2.4 To make decisions on the basis of a simple majority vote. In the case of equal votes, the Chairperson shall be entitled to an additional casting vote.

8. GENERAL MEETINGS

- 8.1 The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held not later than the end of October each year. Written notice of 28 clear days shall be given to Members of the Annual General Meeting by circulating a copy of the notice to every member at their email or home address and posting a notice on the Club website. Members must advise the Secretary in writing of any business to be moved at the Annual General Meeting at least 21 days before a meeting. The Secretary shall circulate or give notice of the agenda for the meeting to Members not less than 14 days before the meeting.
- 8.2 The business of the Annual General Meeting shall be to:
 - 8.2.1 Confirm the Minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting and any General Meetings held since the last Annual General Meeting.
 - 8.2.2 Receive the examined accounts for the year from the Treasurer. The year is defined as running from 1 August to 31 July of the year preceding the Annual General Meeting.
 - 8.2.3 Receive the annual report of the Committee from the Secretary.
 - 8.2.4 Elect an Examiner for the Accounts.
 - 8.2.5 Elect the Officers of the Club (i.e. Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and other General Committee Members).
 - 8.2.6 Review Club subscription rates and agree them for the forthcoming year.
 - 8.2.7 Transact such other business received in writing by the Secretary from Members 21 days prior to the meeting and included on the agenda.
- 8.3 Special General Meetings may be convened by the General Committee, or on receipt by the Secretary of a request in writing, from not less than three Full Members of the Club. At least 21 days' notice of the meeting shall be given.
- 8.4 Nomination of candidates for election of Officers shall be made in writing to the Secretary at least 14 days in advance of the Annual General Meeting date. Nominations can only be made by Full Members and must be seconded by another Full Member.
- 8.5 At all General Meetings, the chair will be taken by the Chairperson or, in their absence, by a deputy appointed by the Club or by Full Members attending the meeting.

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8.6 Decisions made at a General Meeting shall be by a simple majority of votes from those Full Members attending the meeting. In the event of equal votes, the Chairperson shall be entitled to an additional casting vote.

8.7 A quorum for a General Meeting shall be eight Full Members and one from the Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer.

8.8 Each Full Member of the Club shall be entitled to one vote at General Meetings.

9. ALTERATIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION

9.1 Any proposed alterations to the Club Constitution may only be considered at an Annual or Special General Meeting, convened with the required written notice of the proposal. Any alteration or amendment must be proposed by a Full Member of the Club and seconded by another Full Member. Such alterations shall be passed if supported by not less than two-thirds of those Full Members present at the meeting, assuming that a quorum has been achieved.

10. DISSOLUTION

10.1 If at any General Meeting of the Club, a resolution be passed calling for the dissolution of the Club, the Secretary shall immediately convene a Special General Meeting of the Club to be held not less than one month thereafter to discuss and vote on the resolution.

10.2 If at that Special General Meeting, the resolution is carried by at least two-thirds of the Full Members present at the meeting, the General Committee shall thereupon, or at such date as shall have been specified in the resolution, proceed to realise the assets of the Club and discharge all debts and liabilities of the Club.

10.3 After discharging all debts and liabilities of the Club, the remaining assets shall not be paid or distributed amongst the Full Members of the Club, but shall be given or transferred to some other voluntary organisation having objects similar to those of the Club.
